Nancy London: -Resident on West Hamilton Street and wife of John Petersen. After recent attempt by Township to mow daylilies and wildflowers from flowerbed that is in mowing easement, would like to find a compromise so flowerbed can remain. She and her family has lived at residence for over 20 years, unknowingly, flowers were planted in easement well over 20 years ago. No one from Township has ever told her it was illegal. First attempt earlier in year led to flowers being mowed down, no one responded to her husband's inquires which led to recent 2nd attempt to mow by Township which almost led to her husband's arrest. She requests consideration to allow continue growth of flowerbeds without danger of being mowed.

John Petersen: -Distributed handouts to Trustees. In June the Township mowed approximately 16 feet of wildflower meadow on his property that he feels is not justified. He has managed for flowers for over 20 years. The Township seriously damaged the flowers and destroyed the irrigation system in place. He email Trustees with no response. Trustee Gulish and Trustee Justin eventually responded after a 2nd attempt to mow recently by Township personnel. Mr. Petersen gave numerous reasons why he feels he should be able to maintain the flowers which fall with mowing easement. He would like to come to an agreement that doesn't mean destruction of his flowers. The Trustees feel the moving is varranted since property is on a corner lot in which motorists need visibility, as well as bike path visibility. Trustee Brubaker stated the Township will continue to mow 15 ft within easement twice a year. Chairman Justin and Trustee Gulish were in agreement.

Linda Abrogast: -Discussed different noxious weed rules and what the City of Oberlin allows. Encouraged Township to think about biodiversity in future. Offered to help NRT identify native plants in the future. *Trustee Brubaker reiterated that moving will continue 15 ft within easement twice a year.*
