### PUBLIC CONCERNS AND REQUESTS

- Pat Justin: -In regards to Republic Services requesting permission from Ohio EPA to use contaminated soil as cover at Landfill, shouldn't NRT be notified of this request? How can dirt be considered contaminated but non-hazardous? Chairman Justin stated he sent the other Trustees a copy of a letter obtained in which Republic Services is requesting permission from the Ohio EPA to be granted approval to use contaminated dirt as cover at the Landfill. Currently, Republic is receiving the contaminated dirt and mixing in with trash. Trustee Gulish stated he spoke with EPA today and no word was mentioned regarding this letter. Mrs. Justin continued after looking over current contract NRT has with Republic Services, how could Trustee Brubaker and Trustee Gulish agree to contract terms that state the Trustees will not oppose development? Also, quarterly meetings that are held with Republic Services, why can't they be open to the public? Trustee Gulish stated the development opposition was in the previous contract and while negotiating he tried to get removed but Republic Services would not budge on that item. The quarterly meetings are meant for Republic Services to communicate with a Trustee on operations and new updates not to become a complaint session with residents. Trustee Gulish stated he has to think about the greater good of the Township not a select few. Trustee Brubaker stated the Trustees did the best they could during the negotiations.
- **Michelle Tyner:** -Does not like that contaminated dirt is being used for cover at Landfill. Dust has been an issue in the past , if dirt is used for cover it could become airborne when driven on. The last air quality test determined that benzene was present. Ms. Tyner feels there are constant landfill problems and Republic has an issue holding up their end. Residents are being burden with issues and it would be nice if Trustees would help. The Board should stand-up for the residents against large corporations and hold their ground. Residents should be heard asking for help in resolving some of these issues, not always trying to get resolution on their own.
- Marc Davidson: -Chief Hanmer from Oberlin Fire Department is hiring an independent lab for air quality testing regarding EDL. Asked if EDL has been written up by Ohio EPA and fined? Trustee Gulish stated he couldn't say for sure but thought EDL was written up by EPA regarding flame.
- Jeff Riddell: -Lorain County Commissioner speaking on behalf of Issue 20 which will be on the ballot November 7, 2023. This issue allows for an alternative form of government allowing more commissioners and dividing county into seven (7) districts. He feels its not a take over of government but will provide more stability and allow for better representation of each district. There are several open positions within the County and by not filling these positions, he thinks the cost to employ essentially four (4) new commissioners would be paid by positions that are currently open.
